MOTION FOR SPEEDY TRIAL

COMES NOW Defendant Austin Drummond, by pro-se and respectfully moves this honorable Court to expedite all proceedings in this case to ensure Defendant's constitutional right to a speedy trial. Defendant further moves for an order that the District Attorney General proceed expeditiously in all aspects in preparing State's case and providing Defendant everything Defendant is entitled to prepare defence. Defendant's need for a speedy trial comes from concern of lost evidence and diminished memories of witnesses. In support Defendant offers:

1. A delay of one year or longer between an arrest or grand jury indictment and trial will trigger inquiry into a speedy trial violation. State v. Hudgins, 2005, 188 S.W.3d 663

2. The Speedy trial guarantee is designed to protect the accused from oppressive pre-trial incarceration, the anxiety and concern due to unresolved criminal charges, and the risk that the accused's defence will be impaired by dimming memories or lost evidence. State v. Simmons, 2001, 54 S.W.3d 755

WHEREFORE, THE DEFENDANT PRAYS that this Motion be granted in all aspects.
